Birth to 5 years of age, parents looking for extra support to keep their families safe and healthy (Services available in Spanish)	WHO'S ELIGIBLE? Any family in Pueblo County with a child prenatal to three years of age (Services available in Spanish)	WHO'S ELIGIBLE? Families with children birth to three years of age and pregnant women	WHO'S ELIGIBLE? Birth to 3 years of age who receive pediatric care from Southern Colorado Family Medicine
WHAT IS IT? Provides books and materials to prepare the child for success in school, promotes school readiness, and early literacy with parent involvement.	WHAT IS IT? Provides a registered nurse that will visit you in your home throughout pregnancy and until your child is two years old to help you have a healthy pregnancy, healthy baby, and become a better parent.	WHAT IS IT? Provides weekly home visits with direct skill training and resources for parents. Families receive support managing child behavior, keeping their home free of safety hazards, and taking care of their child's basic health care needs.	WHAT IS IT? Provides home visits for families with children 0 to 3 years of age. Families receive early childhood education to promote the parent's role as their child's first and most important teacher as well as health records, developmental screenings, and various resources.	WHAT IS IT? Provides weekly home visits and bimonthly play groups for low income families with children birth to three years of age and pregnant women to promote healthy prenatal outcomes and enhance development of children.	WHAT IS IT? In partnership with the pediatrician, supports families and empowers parents to access quality information, helpful tools, and much needed services during the most important period in their child's brain development.
