EPA Has Identified that Lead and Arsenic May Be Present in Your Neighborhood

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is currently testing Pueblo properties in the Bessemer, Eilers/Bojon Town and Grove neighborhoods for lead and arsenic in soil and indoor dust.

To ensure your family's health we recommend you:

- 1.** Contact us soon to make sure your property has been tested (see contacts on the final page).
- 2.** Follow the simple steps found inside this brochure and share them with your family.



Ways to Protect Your Family's Health



Wash children's hands and feet after they have been playing outside.



Dust window sills and other painted surfaces with a soft, damp, disposable cloth and throw away the cloth.



Damp dust counters and furniture often.



Wash pets and children's toys often.



Wipe your shoes on a doormat or take your shoes off when you enter your house.



Damp mop floors often.



Wash and peel all fruits, vegetables and root crops raised on your property.

Do not eat food, chew gum or smoke when working in the yard.



Paint at older homes can also be a source of lead exposure.



Keep paint in good condition.

Don't try to remove paint in homes built before **1978** yourself — seek professional help.



If you perform renovations in a home containing lead based paint, hire an EPA lead-safe certified firm to perform the work. If you do it yourself, reach out to PDPHE for information to ensure you "Renovate Right."

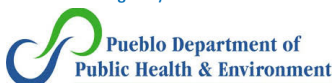
