
PUEBLO COUNTY MARIJUANA LICENSING BULLETIN 22-01

All marijuana licensees and potential licensees are now free to submit all types of Pueblo County Marijuana License Applications through the county's online portal at this link:








After clicking on <u>Sign Up</u> you will have the option to <u>Sign up using Secure Portal</u> or <u>Login using Secure Portal</u>. All new users will need to Sign up. Users with an existing OpenGov account in another jurisdiction may choose the Login option.




Once you have signed up you may begin using the online portal. To complete and submit a marijuana license application click on the <u>Liquor and Marijuana Licensing</u> section.




Marijuana licensees have five options:

- New License and Renewal Application
- Modification of Premises Application
- Transfer of Ownership Application

- Change of Ownership Application
- Change of Location Application



No matter which option you choose the next screen will give you the option to <u>Apply</u> Online.



Once you have selected <u>Apply Online</u> you will begin the application process. The OpenGov Portal will direct you through the process for filling out your particular application.

Applicants will no longer need to provide a completed routing sheet for the Health Department or the Regional Building Department.

A Fire Department Routing Sheet will still be required from your local fire authority. A link to this form can be found on the country website as well as in the OpenGov Portal.

Once the application is filled out completely you will need to upload related documentation, site plans, security plans, certificate of good standing, etc. Please upload all required files as PDFs.

Once your application is submitted you will receive notice of the necessary fees. Fees may now be submitted online using credit card or e-check through the OpenGov Portal. Fees may also be paid in office with a cashier's check or money order. Please note that the county still cannot accept cash or personal/business checks (except e-check).

Once the Application is submitted and the fees paid staff will review for completeness. Once the application is approved as complete you will receive an acceptance letter as usual.

The process from here will be similar to the current process. Depending on the type of application you may receive further notice from OpenGov regarding the status of your application and/or requiring further action on your part.

IMPORTANT: During this transition to the online portal County staff will be entering paper applications into the OpenGov system. Even if you submit a paper application you will receive notices about the status of your application and/or actions you need to

take from OpenGov in your email. If you have any questions about these communications or you are unsure of what to do next, please contact our office.

This is an entirely new process for everyone involved and we do anticipate some minor issues along the way. The Liquor and Marijuana Licensing Division appreciates our licensee's patience. We do request that you reach out to our office directly with any issues you have using the online portal.
